Never walk or stand on coral reefs. Corals are living animals, and reef formations take decades to grow. In fact, some corals take 10 years to grow just 1 cm. Please access the bay's reef area only through the designated wide sandy entrance in the center of the bay, or via the jetty.



Never touch the corals. They are covered by a delicate tissue that is damaged if touched. Moreover, you might be injured by sharp or stinging corals.



Never feed the fish. This is strictly forbidden as it can change their natural behavior and can even kill them.



Never take anything from the sea. That way you help us to preserve our marine life.



Never throw rubbish into the sea. That way you help us to keep the sea clean and protect our marine life.



Never anchor in a reef. We never anchor in the reef. When necessary, we use the mooring buoys to secure your boat.



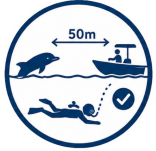

Enjoy Watching Turtles and Dolphins Safely Code of Conduct

Code of Conduct for Dolphins Encounter



- **Keep your distance:** Maintain a respectful distance of at least 50 meters if you are swimming or in a boat. Always keep at the side of the group (parallel) and never dive down from top.



- **Never swim after them:** Let dolphins approach you on their own terms if they are curious. Chasing them causes severe stress.



- **No scooters:** The use of scooters while swimming close to dolphins is strictly forbidden.



- **Keep it quiet:** Enter gently into the water, without jump. Avoid splashing heavily, No shouting or whistling, as loud noises disrupt their sensitive echolocation.

- **Never touch or feed:** Human bacteria can harm dolphins, and feeding disrupts their natural hunting habits.

Code of Conduct for Turtle Encounter



- **Give them space:** Stay at least 3 to 4 meters away, and always swim alongside or behind them—never directly in front of them.



- **Do not block the surface:** Turtles must come to the surface to breathe air. Never swim directly above a turtle, blocking its path up.



- **Never touch, ride, or chase:** Touching a turtle can scare it into drowning or damage the protective layer on its shell.



- **Avoid using camera flashes:** Bright flashes blind and disorient turtles, making them vulnerable to predators or boats.

Please Respect Local Traditions

Egypt is a welcoming country with a rich history and cultural heritage. While resort life is relaxed, local towns and communities are generally more conservative.

Dress Respectfully Inside the Resort

✓ Comfortable summer clothing is perfect inside the resort.

✗ Do not wear swimwear in the lobby or restaurants: Keep swimwear restricted to the immediate pool and beach areas.

✗ Do not go topless: Topless sunbathing is strictly illegal and highly offensive in Egypt!

When visiting towns, markets, mosques or historical sites, modest clothing is appreciated.

✓ Cover shoulders when possible.

✗ Avoid very revealing clothing.

✓ Ask before taking photos: Many people are happy to be photographed—but always ask permission before photographing local people.

✗ Photography may also be restricted at certain government or military locations.

Visiting Mosques

When entering a mosque: ✓ Dress modestly.

✓ Remove your shoes. ✓ Speak quietly. ✓ Respect worshippers.

Women may be asked to cover their hair in some mosques.

Public Behavior

Egyptians value courtesy and respect.

✗ Please avoid excessive public displays of affection outside the resort.
